<u>Reflection</u> - How are you responding to this ongoing virus? Maybe you have 'great sorrow and constant anguish' as Paul expresses in his letter to the Romans. Maybe you feel tossed about by the wind and waves as the disciples did in Mathew's Gospel reading today. Maybe you are just tired, lonely, and ready for life to get back to normal...

As I reflected on the readings today and the times we are in, I found myself not only praying that this virus would soon be over but also that we would each persevere. When things are not going as we want sometimes the approach is to simply take one step forward. One day at a time, one hour at a time, showing up

for work or whatever God has us doing...praying, interceding, loving, serving. Now is probably not the time for the boldness of Peter but rather the earnest seeking of Elijah. The time will again come to step out of our boats and fix our eyes on Jesus and go where He leads but today is a day to slow down, to prioritize loving those we are close to, to prioritize our time with our Father and our Lord and a time to mature our listening skills.

Let us recommit to moving forward, day by day, moment by moment, striving to hear our Lord and, through the power of His Spirit, move forward.

I end with a quote from St. Thomas Aquinas that I heard this weekend: "It is better to limp along the way than stride along off the way". Sisters and Brothers, I hear the Spirit saying that it is OK that we are not accomplishing all the things that we wanted to do this year. This is a time to hunker down, to stay the course in seeking our Lord, living His Will and living our covenant. It is OK even if we are just limping along the path...let us limp together!

Let us pray "Jesus, I focus my entire attention on You. When You say Come, I will come. Until then I will seek You in the stillness of my heart. I will seek You in creation, in the Sacraments, in my sisters and brothers, in the poor, the widow, and the orphan. Be my strength to persevere. Give me hope, faith, an abundant outpouring of Your love, that I may love as You loved me first. I am Yours. Amen." God bless,
